Business Manager's Report

Sisters & Brothers;

Work is starting to move forward with many calls in the Central area and some calls in the East as Spring projects and various shut down projects get off the ground. Please check your training and licenses for current needs to be dispatchable.

The Quinte St. Lawrence Building Trades held a meeting that Local 401 hosted last week with representatives from both Umicore and Worley in attendance. The meeting was filled with information about Umicore's upcoming Battery Materials Refinery project in Bath Ontario, also known as the "Pacman Project". There are still many things not decided as of yet and they will be coming back to give us more details this month as well. The pertinent facts that are of interest is the \$2.7 Billion in value starting in June 2023. There are land moving activities going on already and they plan on completing by the end of June 2026. There will be 3 major Mechanical awards going on simultaneously. All the materials are Stainless and alloy, everything is epoxy coated floors, walls, ceilings etc. The finished plant is akin to pharmaceutical or Nuclear environment meaning extra clean (Their words exactly). Buildings 50-60 meters high and four 100 meter long electric ovens. Equipment is coming from Europe and will be vender installed. We will be given more accurate manpower numbers and potential dates from them by the end of the month. They know that there are many tradespeople needed, approximately 1200 in all trades at peak is their estimate right now. They are maintaining that it will be an open site, meaning both union and non-union will be tendering parts of the project. They prefer that they use local people that are building trades union affiliates and we were clear that we prefer that as well. There were other items we did not agree on including; Drug and alcohol testing, temporary foreign workers, poaching policies etc. We agreed to, and were not asked for, any concessions on our negotiated ICI agreements so far. I will keep you informed as we learn more.

Locally, we held a contractor association meeting with the Zone 12 West group and feel that we had a good discussion with our group in the Central area. They had many concerns to discuss and we are both agreeable to meet again in the fall. The MCA Kingston group has not scheduled a date to sit down with the Local 401 Manager and Agents yet, but I expect they will at some point as we have had some very good discussions informally.

Our bi-weekly staff meetings have been going well with good team work from everyone. The staff have been working especially hard to get our info together for the new website which I hope will be live this month. The website address will remain the same.

Our condolences go out to the family of the Millwright apprentice who was killed in a workplace accident at St. Mary's cement plant a couple weeks ago. Please everyone take an extra moment to ensure we are all looking to our own and others safety. We all want to see our homes and families at the end of a hard day, and they deserve to see us.
