"Effective immediately any apprentice found to be in violation of the Working Rules or By Laws of the J.A.T.C. will no longer be eligible for monetary reimbursement for completing additional education which will include but not limited to trade school & gas technician programs. Additionally, any apprentice in violation of the Working Rules or By Laws of the J.A.T.C. will no longer be credited hours for educational training."
